

SUNDAY JULY 21, 2024 Race For A Case Sailing Instructions

1 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- **1.1** Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole north of the RYC Clubhouse.
- **1.2** When Flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in the race signal AP. This changes Race Signals and RRS S4.2.
- **1.3** In the event any change to these SIs are posted, the Race Committee shall endeavor to signal the change by displaying code flag L ashore. Failure to display code flag L shall not be grounds for redress.

2 SCHEDULE OF RACES

One race is scheduled. The warning signal is planned for 13:00. The warning may be postponed in the event of very light winds. This race is a Pursuit Race with each boat starting at the time indicated for their PHRF handicap as shown on the start time list for 9.6 nm Race posted on the Official Notice Board.

3 MARKS

Marks will be orange, red, green or yellow tetrahedrons or cylinders.

4 THE START

- **4.1** Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.
- **4.2** The starting sequence will be signaled as shown in the table below. Announcements will be made on VHF channel 69.

5 TIME LIMITS

- **5.1** A race will be abandoned if no boat of the fleet finishes within 2-½hours from Time zero.
- **5.2** If any boat finishes within the time limit, then any boats not finishing within 1 hour of the first boat to finish will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35.

6 SAILING THE COURSE

Boats shall start by leaving the Signal Boat to starboard and the starting mark to port. Thereafter, boats may round the designated marks 1,2 and 3 in any sequence they choose, rounding to either port or starboard, provided they pass within one boat length of the mark, and then Finish by passing between the blue flag on the committee boat and the nearby finishing mark in the direction from the last mark rounded.

7 WITHDRAWAL

A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee by hail, VHF radio channel 69, or in person onshore.

8 HEARING REQUESTS


Protests may be filed at the bar. Time limit for filing protests is 60 minutes after the Race Committee boat docks. This changes RRS S13.1-4. RRS 62.2(a) and 66.2(a) not do apply.

9 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at the RYC clubhouse after the race. The skipper must be at least 21 years of age to receive the 1st prize keeper award. In the event of cancelation, abandonment, or if no boats complete the course, prizes will not be awarded.

The distances from Start to mark 1 and from mark 3 to Finish shall each be 2.0 nautical miles.
