

Bernice Wins Race, Retains Fisher Cup; Alloede Fights Hard

Rochester Challenger Out in Front in First Round
but Canadian Defender Comes From Behind in
Choppy Sea and Wins by 45 Seconds—
Skippers Match Wits.

Toronto, Ont., Sept. 10.—Bernice, of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club, yesterday successfully defended the Fisher cup. She won today from Alloede, of Rochester, by 45 seconds, coming from behind in the second round in a hard fought race in a tumbling sea.

In the second round Alloede went over on a port tack and Bernice followed. Skipper Gooderham immediately started splitting tacks and the boats were about even a dozen times in the first mile.

Finally Skipper Mabbett let the Canadian get away and Bernice was one minute and 37 seconds to the good. Alloede was unable to

repeat her performance of the first round and catch Bernice in the second leg. A broad reach pit cut the Canadian's time to one minute. She gained another 25 seconds on the reach to the line.

The breeze freshened considerably toward the end of the race. The finish time was: Bernice, 2:27:10; Alloede, 2:27:55.
