

# NEWEST YACHT CUP TO COST \$2,500

Expected To Arrive in This  
Country within Month;  
Raced for in July.

The new Lipton Trophy for Class R boat competition on Lake Ontario, given to the Rochester Yacht Club by Sir Thomas Lipton, internationally famous yachtsman, is being finished at Goldsmiths and Silversmiths Ltd. of London and is expected to arrive in Rochester within a month.

It will go into competition for the first time in a series of races to be held off Summerville some time next season, probably July 4, 5 and 6. After that it will be a prize in the annual Lake Yacht Racing Association regatta.

The trophy is 36 inches tall and 15 inches wide across the two dolphins making the cup's handles. It is of silver and is reported to



have cost its titled donor 500 pounds. It will be the most pretentious trophy on the Great Lakes.

Emblazoned on one side of the trophy are the green and yellow and red and blue burgees of the Royal Ulster and Rochester Yacht Clubs. Royal Ulster is Sir Thomas Lipton's home club. He is also a member of the Rochester Yacht Club. On the reverse side are the British and United States jacks in full color and a Class R boat under canvas in bas relief, etched out of the silver. Shamrocks, sea horses and dolphins are the trophy's other adornments.

The inscription on the trophy states: "Challenge Cup, presented by Sir Thomas Lipton, Bart, K. C. V. O. to the Rochester Yacht Club for annual competition." On the ebony base of the trophy are ten silver shields waiting for the names of the winning ships and clubs.

Trustees of the trophy include Sir Thomas Lipton, Dr. Thomas Parsons Commodore of the Rochester Yacht Club; Alvah Strong, vice commodore; W. Peck Farley, treasurer and William P. Barrows, president of the Lake Yacht Racing Association.
