

SNAPPY WINDS BRING WIN TO NEWEST OF R'S

Safara Turns Tables on Farley's Rogue in Trial Run.

After winning three straight races in the Class R contests of the Rochester Yacht Club, Rogue, sailed by her owner Peck Farley went down to defeat yesterday before her chief rival, Safara, with Skipper Bill Barrows at the helm. Rogue went down fighting to the very end, but she was not good enough in yesterday's breeze to hold Safara, a yacht that fairly revelled in the snappy wind. It was a corking race from start to finish and skippers and crews on both yachts displayed something like real racing form throughout. The time: Start 2:15 P. M. Course triangular nine miles.

Ever since Safara arrived in her home port it was thought she was a fast boat on the wind, but her ability to outfoot the Rogue on the reaches yesterday was a surprise to most yachtsmen and gives a most encouraging promise for her future work as an all round racer. She will need everything she has, however, to beat the Rogue out in the season's racing. This latter boat is not partial to any point of sailing and all things being equal she is going to be one of the hardest R boats on the lake to beat. She showed her weather qualities yesterday when in two long litches she covered a weather leg that occupied the Safara with six tacks. The same yachts and possibly the M. E. S. and Mybar will be at the line again this morning sharply at 10 o'clock for the third official race of the season.
