## ANNOUNCEMENT

### GEORGE CUP RACES AND L. Y. R. A. REGATTA

The next few weeks will be busy ones for the racing fleet of the Rochester Yacht Club. The "R" boat selected as the George Cup Challenger will race at Chaumont Bay July 28th, 29th, and 30th with boats representing the Royal Canadian Yacht Club of Toronto and the Crescent Yacht Club of Watertown.

The Annual Regatta of the Lake Yacht Racing Association will be held this year at Henderson Harbor on August 4th, 5th, and 6th when yachts from all parts of the Lake will assemble. Headquarters will be at Harbor Inn. Reservations for rooms may be made for Harbor Inn, Tyler's, Gill House, or Warner's Inn. Evening entertainment each night will be held on Association Island through the courtesy of the General Electric Company.

An invitation cruising race from Toronto to Rochester will be held under the auspices of the Rochester Yacht Club. This will bring to our Club all of the Canadian yachts from Toronto and Hamilton. The yachts will leave Toronto in classes from 2:00 P. M. to 3:05 P. M. on Saturday, July 31st. The distance is 83 nautical miles and they should arrive here sometime on Sunday, August 1st. Sunday will therefore be a big day at the club house as the boats will lay over until Monday afternoon, August 2nd. The start of the Freeman Cup race will be at 4 P. M., Monday, August 2nd off the piers for a race down the lake, 70 nautical miles to Stoney Island Gas Buoy. The Freeman Cup was won last year by W. P. Farley with his "R" boat the "ROGUE". There will be eight different classes of boats to start and probably the biggest number of yachts ever started in one race off Rochester. There will probably be everything from the small "C's" to large ocean going schooners.

We want all of our power boats to turn out and we hope that most of them will plan to accompany the yachts to Henderson Harbor. Every captain of a power boat should arrange to be on hand and to take aboard his boat as many as possible of our members to see the start of this great race.
