GENERAL INFORMATION

HEADQUARTERS:

Seaside Park Yacht Club.

TRANSPORTATION:

Seaside Park is within an easy day's towing distance of New York City. It is only a thirty mile off shore tow from Sandy Hook to Manasquan Inlet, then fifteen miles via inland water way to Seaside Park. The Inlet is jettied and navigable in any kind of weather. The bay channels are marked very distinctly. If shipped by rail or truck, consign boats to Berkeley Harbor, Seaside Park. Boats coming from the South may reach Seaside Park via Delaware Bay and inland waterway from Cold Water Harbor, Cape May. It is not advisable to depend on entering through Barnegat Inlet. Both the Pennsylvania and New Jersey Central Railroad serve Seaside Park.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Write Frank T. Lloyd, Jr., Seaside Park, N. J., at your earliest opportunity. Labor Day weekend is the busiest of the local season. We must make reservations for you in advance.

ANCHORAGE:

There are ample facilities for launching and hauling out at Berkeley Harbor, one-half mile from the starting line. There is a nominal charge for this service and for rigging to cover labor costs. If boat arrives before you do, leave instructions as to rigging, launching and hauling.

CONDITIONS:

As this is a sanctioned championship series of the International Star Class Yacht Racing Association, all rules pertaining to such events will apply. Consult 1941 Log Book. There is no entrance fee and no limit to the number of entries from any fleet. Only boats with measurement certificates and in good standing will be eligible. Protests, if any, will be heard immediately upon the conclusion of each race in the lounge of the Seaside Park Yacht Club.

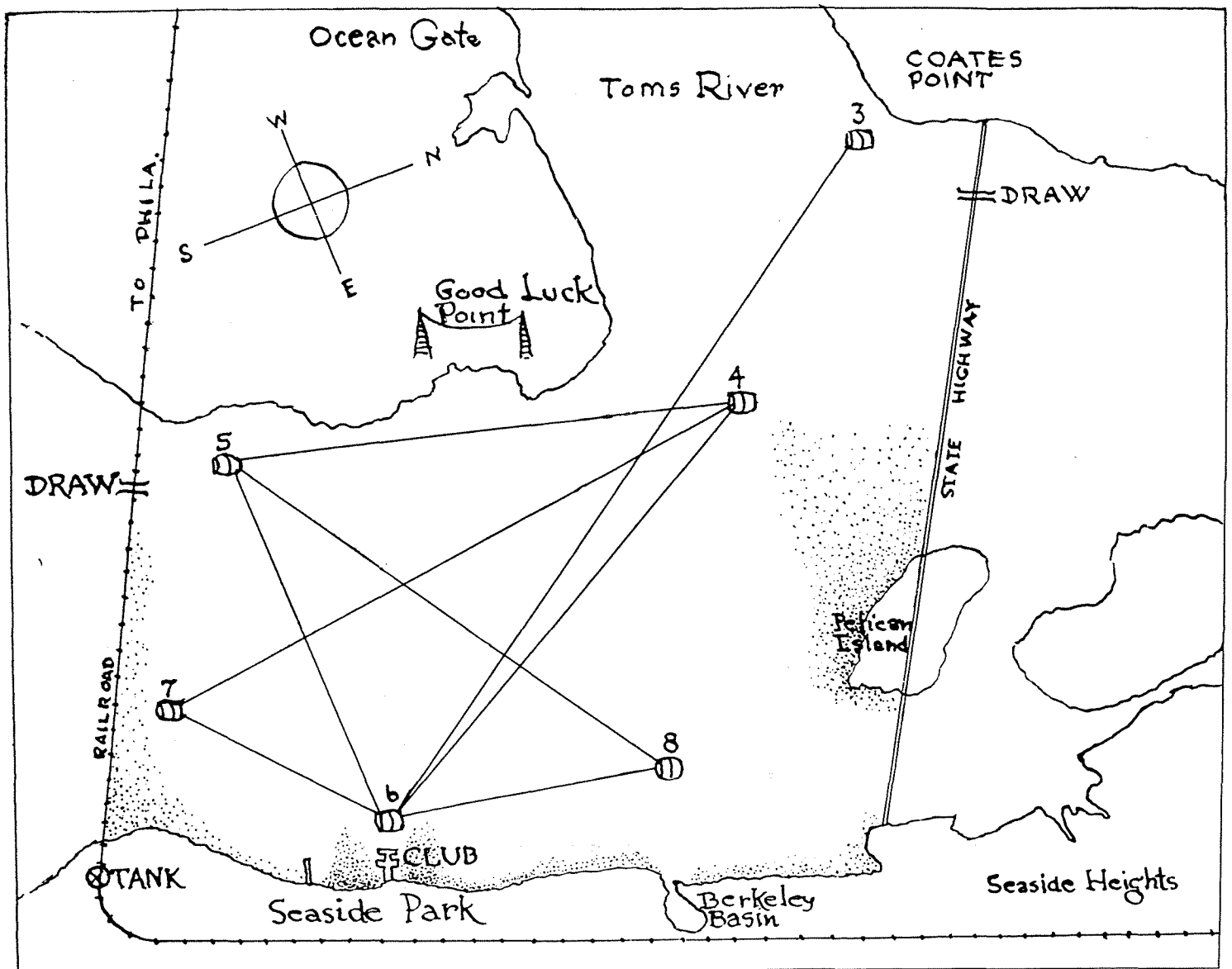
