CARA MIA AND ROGUE WIN THEIR CLASSES

Anona Leads Twenty-Footers at Big Bay Regatta

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)
Belleville, Aug. 7.—The last day of the L.Y.R.A. regatta was the best of the three. There was a fair southeast breeze which later hauled to southwest, a blue sky, and again a large fleet of yachts. The winners for the day were: Class 1—Alice, Commodore Lansing's schooner from Watertown; Crusader of Hamilton, Cara Mia of Henry, and Sherman Hill of Kingston. Peck Farley's Rogue from Rochester, who won three straight races, and the little Anona of Rochester, who saved her time allowance on Scrapper of Kingston, and on Hoyden of Waterdown.

Thorella of Montreal won the yawl class today, but Temeraire, with her two previous firsts wins the class championship.

Two Fail to Start.

The schooners, without Yolanda and Seneca, who did not start, got away at 12:30. The three boats all hit the line on time, promptly began to draw away from Blue Moon and Zoraya, and had a couple of minutes' lead at the end of the first leg, which, with the hauling wind, had turned into a broad. Alice has more canvas this year and takes kindly to the light stuff, whereas Blue Moon, a bigger and heavier boat, looks for a breeze of wind. Zoraya, with Bill Murphy of the Q.C.Y.C. at the helm, squeezed Casey off the first mark, and left him dead for some minutes—no way on and a nice back draft to pull out of. From this point on, Alice pulled gradually away. Blue Moon got Zoraya after a chase and they finished (the race today being only once around) in the same order. Corrected time: Alice, 2.37.36; Blue Moon, 2.53.35; Zoraya, 3.01.18.

In the second class Saita had the start on Crusader, but in the light going the Hamilton boat soon pulled well out and again won handily. Medora was third and Dolphin fourth.

The P. boats, as usual, had the close race. This time Bernice got the start to weather and a head, Cara Mia next, then Alloede, Patricia, Stranger, Italla, Olympian and Nutmeg. On the reach Cara Mia pulled in the lead, Bernice a minute behind; Nutmeg pulled into third place, then Patricia.

On the next leg, which was almost a buck, the order did not change. Pat took a hitch which lost her a little on Nutmeg, but the others proceeded without apparent change to the second buoy. The breeze, which was now around to southwest, made it another close haul, with each boat taking a pitch for clear wind. Cara Mia almost lost in this way to Bernice, leaving her uncovered and going about when both were laying the finish line. Had the wind held as fresh as it then was the Toronto boat would likely have pulled out, but a drop in the breeze and a slight haul to the west helped, and she won by an even minute. Nutmeg finished a good third. Patricia loses the championship to Cara Mia. The finishes were:

Wind Drops at Finish.

The wind dropped for about 10 minutes as the P. boats were finishing, making the times of the last three not what they should have been, as they were closer than the figures would indicate. This drop in breeze greatly affected the R. class results, as time only is concerned—not position. It also affected the 20-footers, taking first place from Scrapper, who finished in a drift.

Nayada, Rogue and Vivia were on time for the class start, all going nicely. Rogue in the reach showed the way, as she has each day, and easily led the way all around. M.E.S. 3, previously the Hilda of Marblehead, Penn., came up for her first appearance in the money and finished third to Kathea, who also looked better in the better breeze than has blown the previous days of the series.

Scrapper finished first, but allows little Anona over 12 minutes.

The C boats were exceptionally close at the finish, Colleen taking the race from Art Phillips's Chum by 12 seconds. Norm Tytler was only another 5 seconds behind Chum. Cordite was a minute and a half fourth, and Cricket another minute back.

Many of the yachts are going farther east and will take part in the race in Kingston on Monday.
