

ROGUE REPEATS VICTORY IN L. Y. R. A. REGATTA

SKIPPER FARLEY KEEPS R. Y. C. YACHT GOING IN DRIFTING RACE; FEW FINISH FOR LACK OF WIND

Tantrum Finishes Ahead in "20-Rater Class" by Wide Margin; Three Rochester Boats Remain in Running for Championships; Alloede Leads Bernice.

Bellville, Ont., Aug. 6.—Big Bay, after teasing Lake Ontario's sailors with a blast of real breeze at starting time this morning, tried its best to emulate the fabled Sargasso Sea for the rest of the day and the second race for the Lake Yacht Racing Association championship ended up in a dreary drifting match. Many of the crews weary of the blistering sun and mirror-like sea put their boats out of the race and the finishes totaled but a portion of the entries. The last boat crossed the line more than eight hours after the start at 12:30 o'clock.

W. Peck Farley of the Rochester Yacht Club kept Rogue in motion and won for the second straight time in Class R, beating Nayada and Lillian E. of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club, the only remaining contestants of the 14 starters.

Tantrum, the Rochester club's smart little "20-rater" sailed a brilliant race in the weightless air and won in her class by a wide margin.

Alloede of Rochester finished fourth in Class P, beating her Fisher chp rival Bernice of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club of Toronto by many minutes. Olympian battled all over the course with Stranger of Toronto and finished in fifth place.

Get Breeze at Start.

The start furnished the only action of the day. A smart breeze picked up 10 minutes before the first class was sent away and white water topped the rapidly forming sea. The breeze held until the tiny Class C boats, tail-enders of the fleet were over the line and then completely vanished.

The jump in the sea quickly flattened and the flat bay reflected the sun to make decks too hot for comfort and cabins like steam baths. The race, aside from the start, was anything but a test of the boats. Catspaws streaked up and down the course and the boat lucky enough to find one went ahead.

Farley Keeps Rogue Going.

Rogue's victory over the light weather Kathea was the result of an excellent start and determination on the part of Peck F.

He kept her going. He remained in second position until the start of the second round, when he gained the lead. He finished in twilight so dark that he could not see the line and sailed a full quarter-mile too high before he realized his mistake.

3 R. Y. C. Boats in Running.

Three Rochester yachts remain in the running for championships. Rogue has her stern line in a clove hitch about the Alcoholic Cup, emblematic of the Class R championships. Lillian E. of Toronto is her nearest competitor. Lillian E. have to win while Rogue is finishing fourth tomorrow to win the cup.

Tantrum has 17 points and is her nearest rival. Scrapper Kingston has 15. Alloede with 13 points has a chance to win in class P. Cara Mia of Toronto is 14 points and Patricia 15.

If sailors' prayers are answered there will be a gale sweeping the bay tomorrow morning. The heavy weather boats have not had the chance this annual regatta usually affords and even the light weather sailors would like to feel their rail going under and taste a bit of blown foam.
