

Rogue And Gardenia In Close Finish For Freeman Cup

Rogue Beats Kathea And Nayada Handily; Result Up To Judges

Time Allowance of About Three Hours and Two Minutes Given Rogue Over Gardenia, 75-Foot Cutter of Royal Canadian Yacht Club, Makes Finish in Some Doubt—Power Yacht Rams Sloop.

It looks as though Rogue, Peck of the little class C sloops about nine o'clock Saturday evening. The little sloop is a total wreck. The two men sailing as crew jumped overboard to avoid injury and were picked up by the Anona, wet but otherwise all right.

The yachts got away Saturday afternoon, going over the starting line in classes, the big fellows first and the little Class C, one class design from Toronto, last. Rogue finished at 5:56 a. m. yesterday, more than an hour ahead of Nayada, Class R sloop from Toronto and champion of the Great Lakes, and more than two hours ahead of Kathea of Watertown, the boat that beat Rogue in both the Lipton and George Cup races.

Rogue had a time allowance of about three hours and two minutes over the Gardenia, 75-foot cutter of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club, which finished at 2:56 a. m. The race between the two boats is therefore very close, but it is believed that the Rogue has won. The judges will not announce the decision until time allowance on all boats has been calculated.

The yachts had a balloon run most of the way and the boats on the outside got the better wind. One mishap marred the race. The power yacht Anona of the Royal Canadian Club rammed one Class division.
