Due to the resignation of Mr. B.A. Harness Jr. as Fleet Captain and Secretary, Messrs. E. J. Doyle And J.A. McConnell were elected Fleet Captain and Secretary respectively.

We are looking forward to an active season. The fleet, largest in R.Y.C. history now numbers fourteen boats and all are on a more equal basis than ever before, being equipped with the latest gadgets, flexible rig and the latest Murphy and Nye or Prescott Wilson sails.

The spring or "warm-up" series found most of our fleet unprepared to join in the competition, due to an usually late spring. The series was won by "Cliff" Baker in his new boat # 1833 "Stars'n II", which he recently purchased from Harry G. Nye. Also making their first appearance was "Homefree" a new Parkman boat purchased By "Ed" Doyle and crewed by son "Mike" or daughter "Aleen".

The DOYLE series found four more boats on the starting line. Judge VanVoorhis, Commodore of the Rocheste Yacht Club, introduced his new South Coast boat "Vivace". The series sailed in a succession of light airs was won by Vice-Commodore Nevin in his "Emmy-Lou" closely pressed by Farley in "Deuce". Third spot went to "Homefree" who was tied with "Greta", a new City Island importation owned by J. Dale and M. Snyder.

Plans for the Twelfth District Champion ship to be held at the Rochester Yacht Club are well under way. August 15, 16, 17 are well under way.
